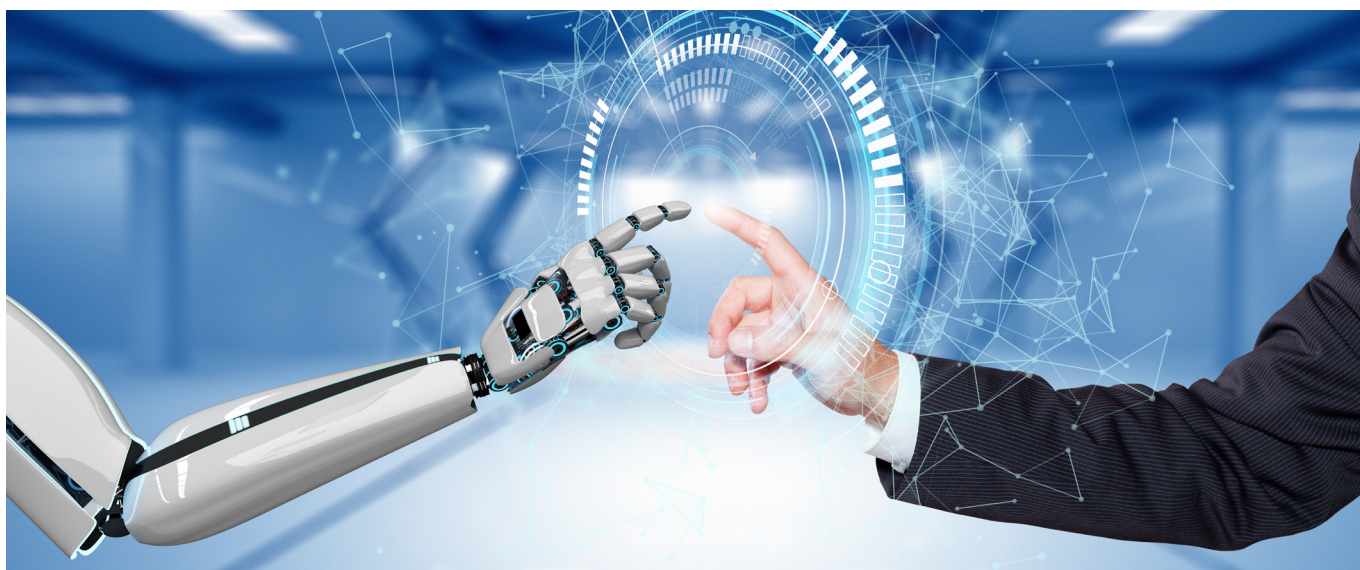

Data protection law

As the legally compliant processing of personal data is increasingly becoming the focus of companies and supervisory authorities, companies need to find their way around the conflict between their business interests and the legal requirements by ensuring their data protection is very well organised. 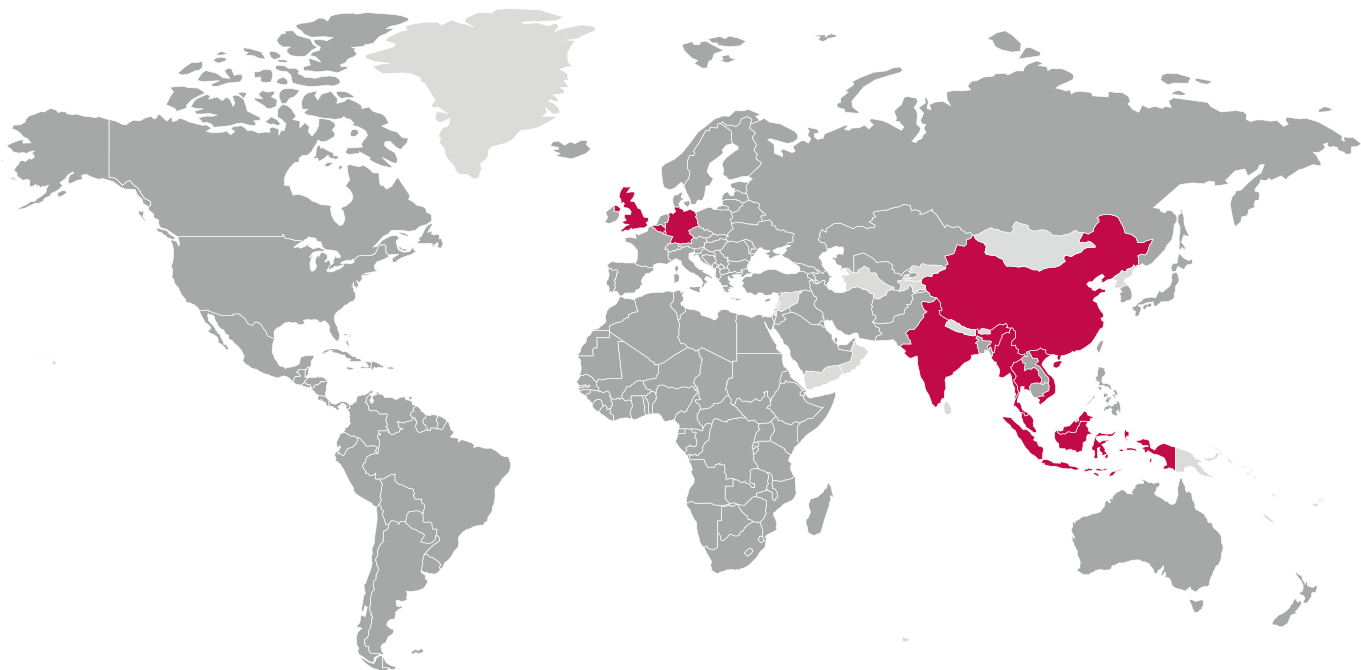

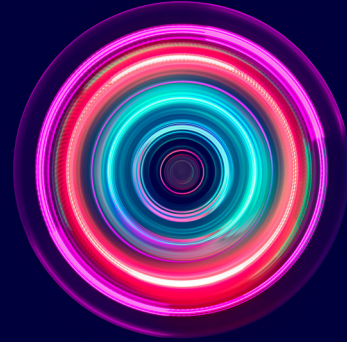

JUVE

In the JUVE Guide of Commercial Law Firms 2024/2025, 58 lawyers from Luther were recommended, and eleven of these were also listed as “leading advisors” and three as “up and coming”.
